I would like to give you a beautiful kiss.

This morning I have had two letters from you  
one dated the 4<sup>th</sup> & the other the 6<sup>th</sup>. The second  
letter told me that you have heard that  
I expect the baby and have missed the  
period. I think it must be all right otherwise  
there is no reason for me to have missed it  
and its a thing I never do. I dont suppose,  
you know, dear, that I shall be nearly as  
sick this time as I was last time. But I  
do expect to be a little presently. I dont  
suppose one does feel the first part as much  
with a second baby. There is so much less  
adjustment for the body I expect after all the  
organs have been used and fairly recently.

Will you often ride with the colonel do you  
think, it would be rather jolly for you if  
you could. I am glad you like him.

really interesting. I hope it will turn
