I wish I could surely know that it will be over by next Christmas what a relief it would be.

I don't know that Mr Rosewoorthy expects much of a victory, but if only it could be over. This is rank heresy I suppose but how can I help feeling it?

I do know what you call race demon, I know it as scumblie patiene & it is a very good

game. Better with three than two, but if you get a great many it becomes too paralyzing a violent. Lets play it sometimes J.B. If I ever have any gaps in smoking packs for Clare that is. I really must never have another daughter it would be too disastrous I could not embroider either enough. Its a sad thought because I do like daughters. Though of course I would rather have a boy next.

Mosula's letter was so late for two reasons. One that I put it in my pocket & forgot it & two that when I had found a few days later you had said dont forward any more letters so I didnt for about a week or rather more.

Clare has a little cold today but she does not seem to be feeling ill with it at all. Its been such a horrid damp day with a thick mist in the morning that she has not been out.

She has accomplished a feat today. She

climbed quite alone onto a chair and  
off again. It was quite a low one of  
course. I really think she does show  
quite a desire to climb.

Will you be wonderfully patient after all  
you have been through, or will you feel  
you have had about enough. I expect it  
will make you long suffering when you  
really come across discomforts like one  
does climbing. But then I think you  
always were very good on those occasions.  
I wonder if I should be. I'll own I have  
clankets because it would be nice to be  
cold that one had to endure & it is  
my chief abomination.

Good night dear I'd like to dream of you  
again. I think I know why I dream  
better than I used. It's because in  
waking moments I seem able to get  
you nearly & to visualize you more  
than I used to. That is partly  
practice I expect & I think it  
partly because when I thought

you were coming home so soon you  
seemed to grow so near. Joy is a  
wonderful thing.

Wednesday After lunch.

Dearest I have had your note this morning  
saying that you may be, that you expect  
to be coming home actually before Christmas.  
I am so happy & so thrilled & pleased.  
It doesn't really matter when it is we  
shall have a glorious time.

I can't really believe that you are coming  
so soon & I shant be very ~~to~~ surprised  
if you dont. One cant help feeling like  
after disappointment. Perhaps I shall have  
another letter with further news this evening  
or to morrow morning.

I cant believe I shall really meet you soon.  
Perhaps you will not get this letter at all  
but will be on your way back before it  
arrives.

Oh darling, darling, I do feel so full of you  
You must try & think in your mind a little  
how you want to arrange your time. Westbrook

you know will be pretty full of people for a week with Christmas day as about the middle of the week. When shall we go to Broken head I wonder, if it would be best to go for Christmas day. The only thing is they might be rather busy & we might not see Avel so easily.

I am glad you are coming now, you may like this yet in another leave before the summer fighting

I wonder what you think of these peace proposals of Germany & their scarcity of food. Perhaps the war will really end next year & we shall be together & happy again. Any way we have ten days coming now.

You know darling that it being Christmas or not make no difference really. when its you coming home. We will have a lovely time.
