

[21st May] [1916]

I can't say much more, because I'm not sure that I might even be telling you I'm at Rovinj, which however you would see from the postmark as I don't know where to go to get a letter censored - I'm shepherding a draft, so to-morrow, presumably I shall be somewhere near the front & learn my fate.

Some sight-seeing to-day! a what sights! St. Mark's <sup>the</sup> the most beautiful church, & far the most perfect architecturally I have ever seen. If ever you come this way with me we will stop here for a day or more.

~~The~~ The party all splitting up now & to-morrow I shall be alone. I am however perfectly happy; I didn't like the waiting. It was very

Sad that I had no letter from you before  
starting, & now I shall have to wait  
another two days at least. However  
you'll be getting my letters & that's a

My darling, I do hope you won't be feeling  
anxious; I will tell you all there

to do that - when I know - I hope  
it won't be very much.
