after my hearty Commendations; Whereas, y^r Heirs & Executors of y^r late lord Audley have full Power & Authority by your Foundation, to appoynt Orders & Statutes for y^r mainteinance of God's Glory, y^r Increase of good learning, & y^r comely Regiment of y^r College: Inasmuch therefore as y^r said Statutes are already appointed, perused & corrected by such Judgment as y^r Executors & I (whom it hath pleased God to appoint for y^r time being, & my Children hereafter as proper Heirs unto y^r lord Audley) have thought meet & convenient: These therefore shall be to will you, by y^r Authority aforesaid to require you, faithfully to receive & obediently to follow, all these Statutes & Ordinances, with all Corrections & Reformations which herein have been thought convenient, as you will answer y^r contrary at your peril. And if any Inconveniencie shall ensue in any particular Statute, by Practice hereafter, because at this present it cannot be throughly foreseen, it shall be lawfull for y^r Master, with y^r Consent of y^r most part of y^r Fellows of y^r College, humbly & reverently to require a Redress of y^r s^t Inconveniency, at y^r hands of y^r said Heirs & their Successors, from time to time, untill y^r said Statutes be made perfect. For y^r better doing whereof, I have at this present required Mr Doctor Helke (now Master) to use his Diligence, and thus nothing doubting of y^r Submission of yourselves accordingly. I commit you to God, to have you all in his keeping, now & for ever.

after my hearty Commendations: Whereas y^r Illustrious Prince, y^r Duke of Norfolk, my noble Grandfather did not only settle & confirm your College lands, but also with y^r unanimous Consent of y^r Executors of your honourable Founder, penned & established all your Statutes & every Clause & Branch therin according to your Founders Will & direction, as appeareth both by his Highness's letters prefixed to y^r Statutes, as also by y^r Certificate & Subscription of y^r Vice-Chancellor & Heads of Colleges remaining with you upon Record; all which said Statutes & every Clause therein were religiously observed & obeyed by Dr Helke then Master, & by all Succeeding Masters & Fellows without Opposition or Detraction. These are therefore by y^r Authority derived to me & my Heirs by Right of Inheritance & Lineal Descent from y^r said Duke my Grandfather, to require you to keep & observe all things enjoyned by y^r Statutes, & to abrogate all Innovations & Customs which may be prejudicial to y^r privileges by y^r Statutes granted to y^r Master of your College belonging to your Patronage & Protection. and I require you y^r present Master to use your Diligence to see y^r Statutes kept & observed; & if you find any man factious or disobedient therin, that then you make use of y^r authority given you by y^r Statutes for y^r quiet Government of y^r said College. and thus not doubting of your performance therin I commit you to y^r Protection of y^r Almighty & rest y^r loving friend

(x3) There is entered in y^r College Book of Copy of a letter pretended to have been sent to y^r College, dated July y^r 30, & signed Suffolke, abrogating & disannulling y^r Additions made to y^r Statutes by y^r means of Dr Helke, but it is mentioned in y^r Statute Book now in common Use as a forgery, & it is added that this Earl who is pretended to have writ this letter, declared to this son Theophilus & several others, that he would not alter y^r College Statutes at all, but that they should continue as they were without any diminution of y^r Masters Powers. and y^r above letter seems to have been pronounced to confirm y^r Society in y^r belief of that forgery.
