January 1601 letter and receipt

He is - This Duke married
Margaret & only Daughter
of Earl of Lord Audley

after my hearty Commendations: Whereas y^e Illustrious Prince, y^e Duke of
Norfolk, my noble Grandfather did not only settle & confirm your College
lands, but also with y^e unanimous Consent of y^e Executors of your honourable
Founder, penned & established all your Statutes & every Clause & Branch
therein according to your Founders Will & Direction, as appeareth both
by his Highness's letters prefixed to y^e s^d Statutes, as also by y^e Certificates
& Subscription of y^e Vice-Chancellor & Heads of Colleges remaining
with you upon Record; all which said Statutes & every Clause therein
were religiously observed & obeyed by y^e Kellie then Master, & by all
succeeding Masters & Fellows without Opposition or Detraction. These
are therefore by y^e Authority derived to me & my Heirs by Right of
Inheritance & Lineal Descent from y^e said Duke my Grandfather, to
require you to keep & observe all Things enjoined by y^e s^d Statutes, &
to abrogate all Innovations & Customs which may be prejudicial to
y^e privileges by y^e s^d Statutes granted to y^e Master of your College
belonging to your Patronage & Protection. and I require you y^e present
Master to use your Diligence to see y^e Statutes kept & ^{my} observed; & if
you find any man factious or disobedient therein, that then you make
use of y^e authority given you by y^e s^d Statutes for y^e quiet Government
of y^e said College. And thus not doubting of your performance therein
I commit you to y^e Protection of y^e Almighty & rest y^e loving friend
May y^e 31st. 1631.

23) There is entered in y^e College Book of Copy of a letter pretended to have been sent to y^e College, dated July y^e 30, & signed Suffolk, avroagating & disannulling y^e additions made to y^e Statutes by y^e means of Dr Helme, but it is mentioned in y^e Statute Book now in common Use as a forgery, & it is added that this Earl who is pretended to have writ this letter, declared to his son Theophilus & several others, that he would not alter y^e College Statutes at all, but that they should continue as they were without any diminution of y^e Masters Power. and y^e above letter seems to have been procured to confirm y^e Society in y^e belief of that forgery.
